

Till Kidnap Trial Starts Next Monday

MONEY, Miss.—The kidnaping trial of two white men acquitted in September of the murder of Mississippi lynch victim Emmett Louis Till is scheduled to start Monday.

On trial will be Roy Bryant and his half-brother, J. W. Milam. Young Till, 14-year-old Chicago-an visiting a great uncle on a nearby farm, was killed after he allegedly wolf-whistled at Bryant's attractive ZI-year-old-wife, Carolyn.

Sheriff George Smith of Les-Flore County has said Bryant and Milam have admitted abducting the lad from the home of Mose Wright. Smith said the paig related they released Till unharmed after it was determined that he was not the one who insulted Mrs. Bryant.

Till was taken from Wright's home on the morning of August 28. His mutilated body was found adrift in the Tallahatchie River three days later.
